A one-page buying and first-print checklist

RTI Wiki | Reviewed 2 September 2026 | A printer is optional, not an RTI filing requirement.

Before you buy

- [] Check whether the receiving authority accepts digital submission. Print only what it needs.
- [] Confirm the exact Indian model supports A4, Android and Wi-Fi Direct or Access Point Mode.
- [] Choose black-and-white laser for the shortlist use case. Check colour needs separately.
- [] Decide: print only, flatbed scanner, automatic duplex, or an ADF for loose-page batches.
- [] Get separate quotes for the printer, genuine toner and imaging drum if separate.
- [] Confirm mains power, desk space, seller, warranty and delivery. Wireless is not battery-powered.

Your first Android print

- [] Install the official print service/app and download a harmless local PDF while online.
- [] Unpack and set up the printer using its manual; load suitable dry paper and connect power.
- [] Enable the documented direct-connection mode, or join phone and printer to home Wi-Fi.
- [] Verify printer name and password. Do not send personal files to a neighbour's printer.
- [] Preview A4, page range, one copy, margins and one-sided/two-sided requirements.
- [] Print one page. Check Hindi text, small numbers, QR codes, page order and signature spaces.
- [] Test again before a deadline. Reconnect the phone to its usual network if needed.
